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Vision Statement

Oxford Academy is a community of innovators dedicated to nurturing the holistic growth of life-long learners who will lead and serve an evolving local and global society.

OA is a 7th through 12th grade college preparatory public school that opened in September of 1998. Recognized as a California Distinguished School, OA draws students from the entire attendance area of the Anaheim Union High School District. Oxford's current enrollment is 1,320 students. The ethnic composition of the student body is 1% African American, 68% Asian, 5% Caucasian, 3% Filipino/Pacific Islander, 17% Latino, and 6% Two or More Races. Approximately 40% of OA students come from economically disadvantaged homes. 62% of Oxford students come from homes in which English is not the primary language with 32 different languages spoken.

Student Selection

Student selection is limited to students entering 7th grade and involves a competitive application process. After an evaluation of the student's past academic records and standardized test scores, eligible students take the entrance exam, which includes an academic portion and an interview that measures soft skills. Each year, over 600 students test for roughly 235 openings. OA admits the top 25 applicants from each of the district's eight junior high feeder areas, as well as the top 35 students from surrounding areas.

Curriculum

All OA students participate in a comprehensive honors curriculum and are required to enroll in a minimum of four Advanced Placement (AP) courses to graduate. The amount of AP courses students can take is limited in 9th and 10th grades. Last year, graduates were academically prepared for college/university with over 95% of them meeting the minimum University of California (UC) eligibility requirements.

Class Rank and Grading

OA does not rank students. In 9th grade, students can take an AP course only if they choose a Computer Science Pathway. In 10th grade, students may take only one AP course, unless they are in the Computer Science Pathway. Only honors and Advanced Placement courses approved by the UC system are given weighted grade points.

Special Programs

In addition to OA's rigorous college preparatory program, all students participate in one of four career pathways. Students who select the Biomedical Science Pathway explore health and engage in advanced science learning. In the Business Pathway, students learn a broad range of business and marketing concepts. In the Engineering Pathway, students dig deep into the engineering design process, as well as apply math, science, and engineering standards to hands-on projects. Students who select Software Systems and Development Pathway are taught to use their computation and critical thinking skills to create new technologies that can be used in various fields. All students are expected to complete a pathway of their choice in 3 consecutive years beginning in 9th or 10th grade.
