Forensic Files

Do you enjoy mysteries and solving crimes? Are you interested in upholding the law or becoming a detective? Forensic Files will fascinate you with evidence, crime scene investigation and careers in the forensic science field. Dust off your fingerprinting skills and take the challenge of solving the crime of the century!

Grades 7-12

Beginning Digital Photography

Monday/Wednesday

Capture the world through your own lens! Learn about the basic functions of a digital camera including aperture, shutter speed, and ISO. Explore different photography careers that involve portraits, events, and photojournalism. Create your own digital photography portfolio by completing daily projects that explore lighting techniques, motion and other exciting elements. You may bring your own digital camera or borrow one of ours!

Civil Engineering

Monday/Wednesday

Do you enjoy working with your hands and building things? If your answer is "YES!" then this is the course for you. Learn how civil engineers use the application of physical and scientific principles to help them with many architectural designs and constructions. In this class you will get to design and build your own 3D home, build and test a T-bot robot that is powered only by water (hydraulics), design and build different structures and bridges, and much more. Come and explore what it takes to be a Civil Engineer!

Golfology

Tuesday/Thursday

Ever wonder how the game of golf was created? What does the number on the bottom of a golf club mean? Have you ever made a golf ball fade? Get all your questions about golf answered in Golfology. This class will help you develop the skills necessary to play the game of golf. You will learn putting, chipping, pitching, bunker play and the full-swing using all the clubs in your bag.

Graphic Design: Changing the World with Adobe Photoshop

Have you ever wondered how to make an old photograph look new again or create an awesome poster of you standing on the moon? This is the power of Adobe Photoshop. Through images, it allows you to manipulate the world around you. In this course, members will explore different theories and tools to create their own Photoshop design.
